Theft of the vehicle, Rig, Forklift, and other equipment (vehicle).	Use of a vehicle in a terrorist act
Theft of the contents of the vehicle	Physical harm to personnel
Persons / Property affected	
All Employees - particularly those who drive/operate plant as part of their work	General Public

Control Measures already in Place	PPE Required
1. The Company will have an operational Security & Counter Terrorism policy.	Safety helmets <input type="checkbox"/>
2. Daily vehicle checks to ensure the vehicle has not been tampered with and a further quick check after returning from a short break.	Hi-Vis Jackets <input checked="" type="checkbox"/>
3. All Vehicles should be kept locked, and keys removed when unattended.	Safety footwear <input type="checkbox"/>
4. Engine should be turned off if the driver is not in the cab and vehicle made safe	Eye protection <input type="checkbox"/>
5. Journeys should be planned in advance.	Dust masks <input type="checkbox"/>
6. Short-term stops should be within sight of your vehicle and longer or overnight parking should be at well-lit and secure locations.	Ear plugs <input type="checkbox"/>
7. Drivers to be aware of suspicious individuals, vehicles or locations.	Earmuffs <input type="checkbox"/>
8. Mobile phones must be charged and available should an emergency arise	Gloves <input type="checkbox"/>
9. Spare keys to be kept locked in the office key safe	Protective overalls <input type="checkbox"/>
10. Company to keep a key register	Gauntlets <input type="checkbox"/>
11. Only authorised personnel should use the Company vehicles.	Harnesses <input type="checkbox"/>
12. All vehicles should have alarms and trackers.	Breathing apparatus <input type="checkbox"/>
13. The building should not be left unattended without the security alarm being operated.	Face masks <input type="checkbox"/>
14. Entry to the building is by doors controlled by a keypad.	
15. The gates to the yard should be kept closed wherever possible.	
16. Roller shutter doors should be closed if unattended.	
17. Visitors to the company should be accompanied through the building.

Additional Controls required	PPE/Equipment
Take extra care at all times whilst driving and within the building and Yard area – mainly 7.30am to 6pm	<b>All personnel MUST wear the appropriate level of PPE for the activity they are involved with or area they are in</b>
All employees to have read the operational security & counter terrorism policy.	
The employee must be adequately trained and competent to operate in the area in which they are to work.	
The employee must be adequately trained, competent and have a license if they are to drive or operate a vehicle.

Likelihood	
1. Very Unlikely	A freak combination of factors would be required for an accident/incident to occur
2. Unlikely	A rare combination of factors would be required for an accident/incident to occur
3. Possible	Could happen when accidental factors are present but otherwise unlikely
4. Likely	Not certain to happen but an additional factor may result in an accident/incident
5. Very Likely	Almost inevitable that an accident/incident would occur
Hazard Severity	
1. Negligible	Negligible injury, no absence from work
2. Slight	Minor injury requiring first aid
3. Moderate	Injury leading to a lost time accident
4. High	Involving a single person with a serious injury / death
5. Very High	Multiple persons with serious injury / death
Outcomes	
LOW	Score (1-6) May be acceptable. Annual Review to see if risks can be reduced further
MEDIUM	Score (8-10) Identify controls must be identified or specific method statement required
HIGH	Score (12-25) Task <b>must not</b> proceed. Senior Management to consider if the risks can be reduced by purchase of additional training, additional equipment, additional staff, additional signage, safe system of work, permit to work or radical changes in method.
